Of course, I'm also beyond thrilled to witness the important work happening in South Shore Hospital's West Unit as a result of Alan McKim's remarkable \$5.3 million gift. Coming off of the busiest year in the health system's 102-year history, expanding care space to meet the high demand for local care will continue to be a top priority as we navigate 2025.

But as an organization, South Shore Health's mindset and goals remain as steady and clear as ever. Last fall, Alan McKim, founder of Norwell-based Clean Harbors, donated \$5.3 million to support the health system's emergency services. The gift will be put to work easing high patient numbers in the hospital's Emergency Department (ED) which had its busiest year on record in 2024.

With patient and colleague safety at the forefront of its mission, South Shore Health made several changes to accommodate unprecedented volume throughout the year, including increasing staff in multiple units across the system, adding 120 temporary surge beds, expanding and reconfiguring much of its ED space, and investing in over \$2 million dollars of new equipment such as beds, stretchers, and wheelchairs.

But with an average of 332 patients in the ED each day, more needed to be done.

McKim's gift will help double capacity in the West Unit: a short-stay unit that allows stabilized patients who are in an ED bed to move to an observation setting that is more appropriate for their care needs. This opens up

critical care space in the ED for incoming patients who need immediate, often lifesaving, interventions.

During his remarks at South Shore Health's *Moonlight & Miracles* Gala on October 18, McKim addressed 470 community supporters saying:

"The caregivers at the health system have blown me away. Against mounting odds, they have cared for the people in this community – a widening community – with resolve, composure, and superhuman stamina. Without this emergency department, the health and well-being of the region is dangerously jeopardized. Let's be proactive, future focused, and just sensible. Let's support the system that can provide the care that each of us hopes we won't need, but sleep better knowing it is here if and when we do."


Alan McKim and his family's charitable foundation have donated \$16.9 million to South Shore Health since 2008 supporting pivotal projects such as the Emerson expansion, the creation of the Dana-Farber Brigham Cancer Center at South Shore Health, and the construction of the Richard and Joann Aubut Critical Care Unit. The McKim Family Foundation is managed by Alan's four children and supports many other local charities across the area including the

South Shore YMCA, Wellspring, and Norwell Visiting Nurse Association.

McKim is also extraordinarily generous with his time, currently serving as a member of South Shore Health's Board of Directors where he chairs the Finance Committee. "Alan is a true champion of the South Shore Health mission," says Lauren Spencer, Senior Vice President and Chief Development Officer. "Our entire community is fortunate to have him as a visionary supporter."

McKim's company, Clean Harbors, is the largest hazardous waste disposal company and the largest re-refiner of used oil in North America. The company was founded on the South Shore in 1980 and, since then, has expanded to more than 400 service locations throughout the United States, Canada, Mexico, and Puerto Rico. Clean Harbors played a crucial role at Ground Zero in the aftermath of the 9/11 tragedy and was also involved in clean-up efforts after Hurricanes Katrina and Rita, the Deepwater Horizon spill, the Kalamazoo River spill, and the 2015 avian flu outbreak.

A deep sense of community, coupled with an ability to solve challenging problems, has not only made Alan McKim an enormously successful businessman—it has made him an inspiring partner, one who has had an immeasurable impact on the advancement of our mission and vision to be the first place our community turns to for health and wellness.

South Shore Visiting Nurse Association Milestone

2024 marked the 30th anniversary of South Shore VNA joining our health system. Over the past three decades, the South Shore VNA team has provided expert, in-home care to patients of all ages in more than two dozen towns across the region.

The VNA has earned its reputation for delivering high-quality care, a reputation further cemented earlier this year when our community selected the VNA as one of *South Shore Home, Life & Style's* Best of the South Shore (BOSS) Award winners. Weight Loss Surgery Program

South Shore Health surgeon, Dr. Neil Ghushe—fellowship trained in bariatric surgery and an instructor of surgery at Harvard Medical School—just performed his one thousandth bariatric surgery at South Shore Hospital in January 2025.

South Shore Hospital's Center for Metabolic and Bariatric Surgery, in collaboration with Brigham and Women's Surgical Associates, is an

accredited comprehensive weight loss surgery program that includes state-of-the-art surgical treatment as well as a team of experts who provide lifetime nutritional and behavioral health support—a key component to long-term weight-loss success.

"Over the past seven-plus years, Dr. Ghushe and his team have built a highly regarded program that provides life-changing care to patients on the South Shore," said Fred Millham, MD, Chief of Surgery. "This milestone is a testament to Dr. Ghushe's commitment both to his craft and to his patients. He is a tremendously skilled surgeon and we're fortunate to have his expertise and leadership on the South Shore."

Community Benefits at South Shore Health

As a not-for-profit community health system, South Shore Health does more than treat patients seeking preventative, specialty, or emergency care. We proactively work to make the South Shore a healthier place to live for all residents. In order to do this, the health system embarks on a rigorous community health needs assessment every three years.

Here, Liz Cullen, South Shore Health's Director of Community Benefits and Strategic Initiatives explains this process and the 2024 findings.

What is the function of South Shore Health's Community Benefits Program?

In our community, there are many people at risk of not receiving adequate medical care due to language barriers, financial pressures, transportation difficulties, stigma, or insufficient insurance coverage. South Shore Health's Community Benefits invests in local initiatives that help residents—especially vulnerable and underserved populations—work through these barriers to access the healthcare they need and deserve. Rather than duplicating the work of other community organizations, we work in tandem with local Councils on Aging, schools, regional YMCAs, community health alliances, transportation providers, community groups, social service providers, and collaborations on specific target areas (substance use, homelessness prevention, etc.) to connect individuals and families with resources that can enhance health and well-being.


What is the Community Health Needs Assessment?

A community health needs assessment, or CHNA, is a collaborative effort that provides a comprehensive picture of the pressing health challenges facing residents across the South Shore. Six months of secondary data analysis, community surveys, stakeholder interviews, and focus groups help us compile the CHNA report that identifies current health trends, risk factors, and disparities that negatively impact health outcomes. Based on the findings, South Shore Health then develops an implementation strategy to address these needs.

Can you share the findings of SSH's 2024 CHNA?

We examined data and compiled community engagement feedback from 33 towns and cities from Quincy to the Cape Cod bridges. Following a thorough review of the findings, South Shore Health has identified four key priorities for 2025:

- 1. **Mental health** emerged as one of the most pressing concerns across all community input sources. High levels of stress, anxiety, depression, and

other behavioral health conditions were reported, particularly among youth, older adults, and economically disadvantaged populations. Access to mental health services remains limited, with long wait times and a shortage of providers exacerbating the issue.

2. **Substance use**, particularly opioid use, continues to be a major public health concern in the region. The assessment found rising rates of substance use disorders and substance-related deaths, with fentanyl use and alcohol misuse being particular areas of concern. Co-occurring mental health and substance use disorders further complicate treatment options for affected individuals.
3. **Complex conditions and chronic diseases** such as hypertension, diabetes, and cardiovascular disease continue to affect large portions of the population. Rates of obesity and related cardiac conditions remain concerning, with lifestyle factors and limited access to preventive care being significant contributors.
4. Ensuring **timely and equitable access to care** is a key priority for improving overall community health. Issues such as transportation, high healthcare costs, and insurance limitations restrict access to primary and specialty care for many residents, particularly for low-income and immigrant populations.

Across all of these priorities there will be a focus on health equity: fair opportunity for every individual to achieve optimal health. Vulnerable populations including seniors, non-English speakers, and low-income families experience significant health inequities driven by burdens such as housing and food insecurity, lack of transportation, economic instability, and more.

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




